

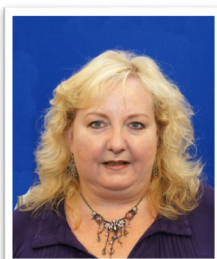
# THE GOVERNING BODY OF CAEDMON COLLEGE WHITBY
